About PJ Masks

Power Up! with Connor, Amaya, and Greg—regular kids by day who turn into heroes by night. When they put on their pajamas and activate their animal amulets, they transform into their hero alter egos—Catboy, Owlette, and Gekko—and embark on adventures where they solve mysteries and learn valuable socialemotional lessons about friendship, cooperation, and teamwork.

How to Use the Program

This program can be used at school or at home. Make photocopies of the three activity sheets to use in class, or email them to families to use at home along with the parent/caregiver letter to extend the learning and fun. Help younger children by reading each activitiy aloud.

ACTIVITY I Power Up

Power Up Teamwork!

The PJ Masks work as a team to accomplish their goals. This activity reinforces the concept of collaboration and teamwork. Begin by asking children why it's good to work as a team. Give some examples to start, such as working together with friends can be more fun than working alone, or each person in the team can perform a certain job so no one has to do all the work. Then, to illustrate the idea of teamwork, provide each student with a set of blocks and have them work with a partner to build a tower. When they're done, ask them what they liked about working as a team—just like the PJ Masks. Was it fun? Did you help each other? Was it easier to build the tower together? Explain that working as a team can help you succeed faster and with more fun.

Next, distribute the activity sheet and read the directions aloud. Children will work with their partners to count the number of blocks between Catboy, Owlette, and Gekko (who are on the ground) and Romeo's Flying Factory (in the air). Each team should use their blocks or other manipulatives to display the number they have counted on the sheet. Have teams share their answers.



In this activity, children will create their own hero masks. To begin, ask children, What is a hero? Have the children share their ideas. Next, ask them to focus on the characteristics of a hero. How do they act? How do they help others?

Explain that an everyday hero is someone who helps others. Have the children share ways in which they act like a hero every day, for example, by being kind, helping a friend, or working together with others.

Next, reinforce the hero theme by distributing the blank mask activity sheets, inviting the children to decorate their own hero masks. Provide them with crayons, markers, paint and paintbrushes, pom poms, glue, or other craft supplies to decorate their masks. Ask the children to create a hero name and help them write it on the sheet.

To extend the activity, ask the children to brainstorm a story about an adventure their heroes have with the PJ Masks trio. When they're done, the children can draw a picture about the story or a picture of themselves as heroes.

Power Up

Power Up from Day to Night!

The PJ Masks are regular kids by day and heroes by night. In this activity, the children will sort items into categories, inspired by the concepts of day and night. To introduce these ideas, ask the children to name things they do during the day (for example, go to school, eat lunch, play on the playground, etc.). Then ask for ideas of what kids do at night (eat dinner, put on their pajamas, get a good night's sleep, etc.).

Next, distribute the activity sheet, which features pictures of a sun (day) and a moon (night). Have children use a crayon or marker to circle the things they use during the day and have them put a square around the items they use at night. As an extension, ask the children to draw a picture of themselves as a regular kid during the day and a hero at nighttime. Have the children share their drawings and explain what changes they make when becoming a hero and why?

Answers: Sun – ball, bike, backpack; Moon – bed, pajamas, lamp






Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Your children are working on lessons to *Power Up!* their friendship, teamwork, and imaginative play, as well as problem-solving, counting, and social-emotional skills, with help from hero friends the PJ Masks and activities from the curriculum specialists at Young Minds Inspired.

To support these lessons, ask your children about the activities they did in school and try out the extension activities below as a family.

• **Be a hero in your town!** As a family, identify something in your community that needs your help. For instance, you could decide to pick up litter in a nearby park, set up recycling bins at home, or bring food and toys to pets at the local animal shelter. Then make a plan to put your ideas into action. For more help in finding family-friendly volunteer opportunities near you, check out doingoodtogether.org.



- Form a hero fam! Over dinner, play a cooperation game where family members brainstorm together to solve a problem, just like the PJ Masks. For example, pretend you need to rescue a kitten from a tree. What steps do you need to take to save the day? Or you could plan how to help cheer up a friend who is feeling sad, or what to pack in a beach bag for a family day trip. Go around the table asking each family member to contribute an idea to help you succeed on your mission.
- Save the Day from 1 to 10! Go around the dinner table and have each family member add an item to a list, counting out each until you get to ten. You can start with 10 things a hero needs (a mask, a cape, a vehicle). Then move on to 10 ways to be a good friend or 10 foods that can help you power up with energy.

Want more ideas? After watching an episode of *PJ Masks* on Disney Junior, start a discussion using one of these prompts:

- Identify a moment where Catboy, Owlette, and Gekko are being good friends to each other. Why was friendship important to save the day?
- Brainstorm ideas on alternate ways that Catboy, Owlette, and Gekko could have solved a problem during the episode. Get creative—the sillier the solution, the better!
- 3- Share a problem you've faced as a grown-up and ask your child how they would solve the problem. Work together to decide on the best solution.
