What is Adopt a Cow?

- A **FREE**, fun year-long educational enrichment program that pairs K-12 classes with a New England dairy farmer
- An opportunity for students to get a closer look at life on a New England dairy farm through an interactive experience, including a **virtual live chat with your farmer** to ask questions and meet your adopted calf

How does Adopt a Cow work?

- This Fall, your class will receive an introductory packet that includes:
 - Your calf's name
 - Her birthday
 - Where she lives
 - How the farmer takes care of her
 - A special treat: A printed photo of your adopted calf and official adoption certificate!
- Throughout the school year, your class will receive:
 - Progress updates to watch your calf grow
 - Photos of your cow and host farm
 - Information about life on the farm
 - **Free standards-based lessons and student activities** that support Common Core standards

How can the Adopt a Cow program support students' learning?

- Reinforces English language arts, math, and science skills through the free lessons that complement your curricula, as well as class discussions, video activities, and letter-writing to your host farmer and your adopted calf
- Brings the dairy farming experience to life, raises awareness about local or state businesses, and reinforces nutrition



Dairy Cow Fun Facts



- There are 7 main breeds of dairy cows. Holstein (which has black and white spots) is the most common breed.



- Cows sleep for about 12 hours each day.



- Cows drink about 35 gallons of water and eat about 50 pounds of feed per day.



- Dairy cows produce more than 8 gallons of milk each day.
