



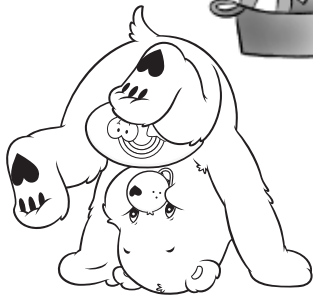

You're Never Too Young to Care

DEAR PARENT OR GUARDIAN,

Your child is participating in a special educational program called **You're Never Too Young to Care** featuring the lovable Care Bears. The program runs in conjunction with the fourth annual **National Care Week**, November 4-10.

Your child is completing a series of classroom activities to promote caring and sharing and to boost reading-readiness, fine-motor development and communication skills.

Look at the pictures from the accompanying activity with your child and talk about how they depict ways they can care—for family and friends, for the community, and for the earth.

CARING TOGETHER

Try some of the ideas below and create your own family caring and sharing project during **National Care Week**—or any time!

- **SCHOOL**—Have your child make a card of appreciation for the teacher. Include your own note as well.
- **HOME**—Make a special care package for a family member who does not live with you. Include family photos and a letter to catch them up on family news.
- **NEIGHBORHOOD**—Help an elderly or sick neighbor. Offer to do grocery shopping (your child can hold the neighbor's list), yard work (your little one can help rake or pull weeds), or simply retrieve mail. Visit www.1-800-volunteer.org and look for the Family Cares Hurricane Helper section.
- **EARTH**—Think green! Buy products that come in recyclable packaging, purchase rechargeable batteries, and wrap birthday party gifts in recyclable bags that your child decorates.

If this event is not taking place at a mall near you, have your child bring a book to class. Your school will donate it to a worthy organization in your community. Ask your child's teacher for details.



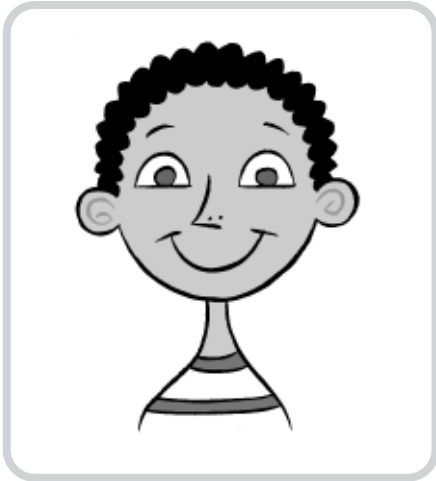
