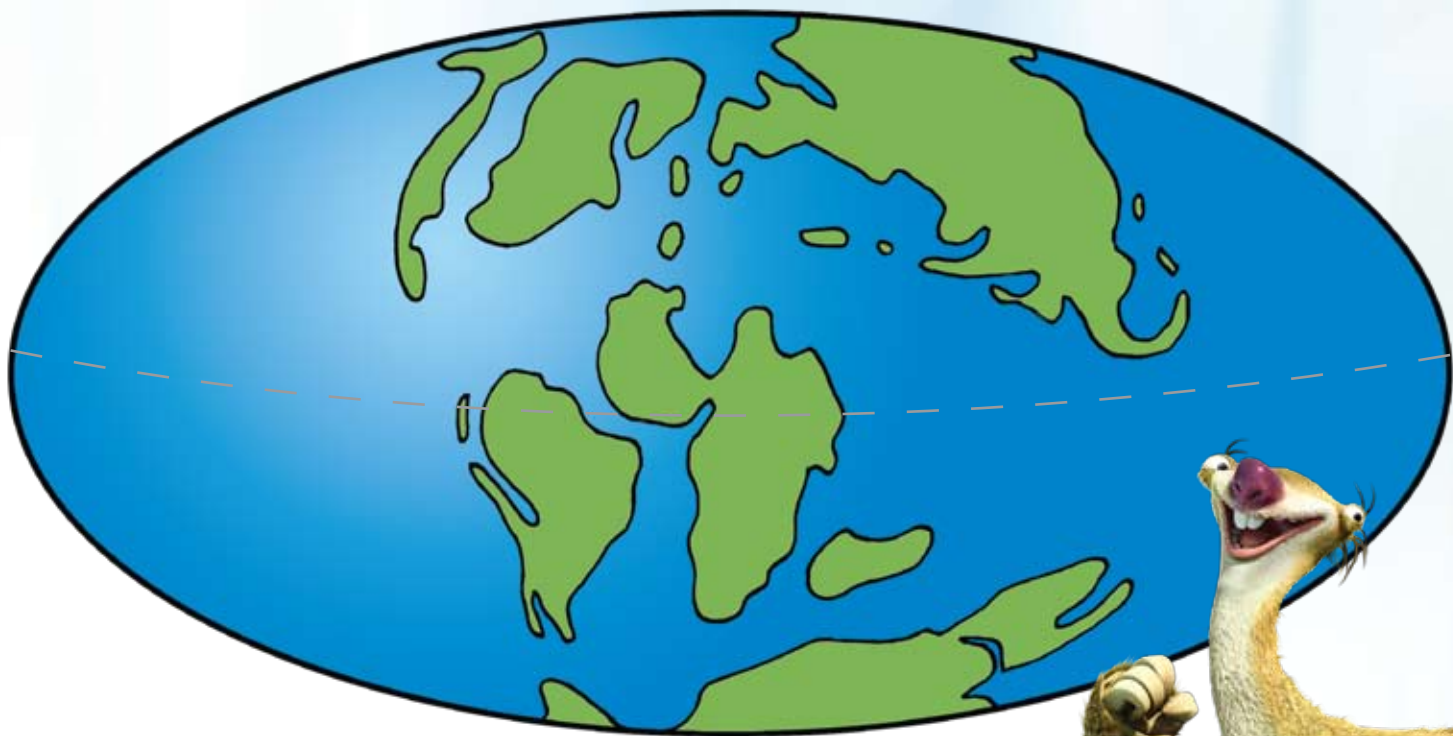


JOIN EARTH'S JOURNEY THROUGH ICE AND TIME

Can you spot the differences in Earth's polar regions?

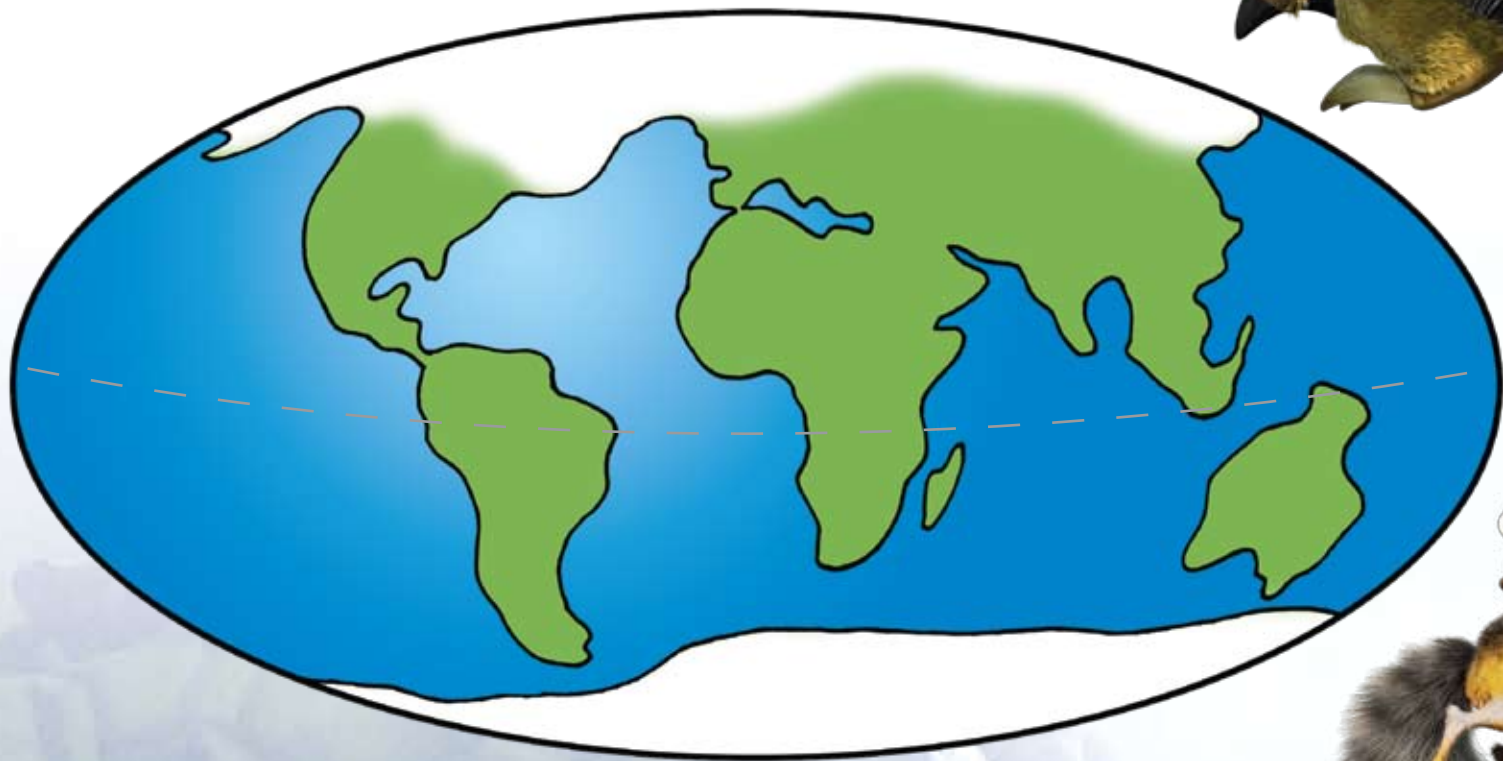
CRETACEOUS PERIOD

Time of the dinosaurs—144 million to 65 million years ago and part of the Mesozoic Era



PLEISTOCENE PERIOD

Time of the Ice Age—1.8 million to 10,000 years ago and part of the Cenozoic Era



HALOCENE PERIOD

The last 10,000 years of Earth's history up to modern day and part of the Cenozoic Era
