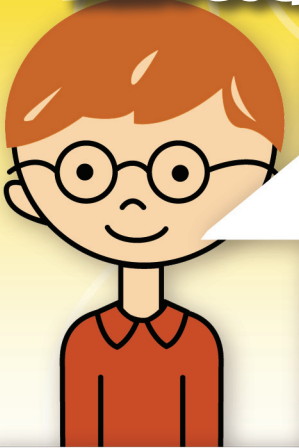


Head Lice Facts from Max



Hi! I'm Max. And I know a lot about head lice—insects that live in people's hair.

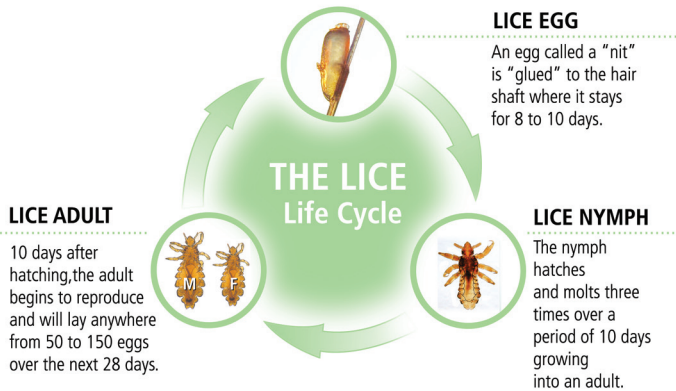
Head lice are almost always spread through direct head-to-head contact from someone who has lice. This includes contact such as sharing a bed or playing together.

If you see just one of these critters, it's called a louse—but one adult louse can lay up to 150 eggs (called nits), and then you've got head lice!

Head lice aren't dangerous, but they make your head itchy as they nibble at your scalp to suck blood. Yuck!

So when you feel extra itchy, always ask the school nurse or a parent to check your head for lice and nits.

Any person with hair on their head can 'catch' head lice by direct head-to-head contact with another person who already has head lice. 5. F. Nits, or lice eggs, cannot move and they can't brush off from one person's head to another. They are cemented onto hairs on your head by an adult female louse. 6. F. Getting rid of head lice requires treatment that can include a special comb and gel or lotion.
