- To strengthen student vocabulary skills and understanding of story development.
- To promote critical thinking skills by encouraging students to make connections between the movie's themes and their own experiences.
- To encourage visual literacy skills, including the understanding of how visuals support the interpretation of story nuance, action, characters, setting, and plot.

HOW TO USE THIS PROGRAM

Photocopy the teacher's guide and activity sheets. Display the poster, referring to it often throughout the program. Schedule the activities to fit in with your existing ELA curriculum studies. Direct students to take completed activity sheets home to share the *Paddington At Home* sections with parents.

Start by reading the original story of *A Bear Called Paddington* by Michael Bond aloud to students. Follow up by reading the **About Paddington** section of this guide, which introduces the new movie. Challenge students to make predictions about how Paddington's new adventures might turn out.

ABOUT PADDINGTON

Paddington has already become an instant family classic! This iconic bear's experiences with his new family are instantly relatable to kids, as he learns to brush his teeth and eat in a restaurant — all of which Paddington does in his own unique and charming way.

Paddington has grown up deep in the Peruvian jungle with his Aunt Lucy who, inspired by a chance encounter with an English explorer, has raised her nephew to dream of an exciting life in London. When an earthquake destroys their home, Aunt Lucy decides to smuggle her young nephew on board a boat bound for England to search for a better life. Arriving alone at Paddington Station, Paddington soon finds that city life is not all he had imagined — until he meets the kindly Brown family, who find him with a label tied around his neck which reads, "Please look after this bear. Thank you." They offer Paddington a temporary home while he searches for the explorer who impressed Aunt Lucy all those years before.

But when Paddington catches the eye of a sinister taxidermist, it isn't long before his home — and his life — are in danger!

ACTIVITY ONE

Distribute the activity sheet and read the information and directions out loud together. Review the story concepts of beginning, middle,

students that film stories have a beginning, middle, and end, just like written stories. Direct students to color and match the images and sentences as follows: Beginning: 2, Middle: 1, End: 3

When students have completed the matching activity, have them take turns telling the story to a partner. They should use their imaginations as well as the sentences and pictures to narrate the action. Challenge older students to write their story, complete with a title, on a separate sheet of paper.

ACTIVITY TWO

Before distributing the activity sheet, explain to students that, just like in books, pictures in films and DVDs help us identify details that give information about a story setting. Filmmakers use imagery to guide our expectations and also to surprise us when, on occasion, events occur that seem out of place.

Distribute the activity sheets, and challenge students to determine facts about the setting from the pictures. For example, does this part of the story action occur in Peru? In London? On a train? At the Brown's home? Have students cite visual evidence from the image to explain their responses. For example, students may cite people and objects in the picture, what people are wearing, or actions that are occurring in the image. Then, guide students to the conclusion that the scene shows Paddington caught in the crowd as he arrives at Paddington Station after traveling all the way from Peru.


Next, have students share their thoughts about what Paddington might be thinking or how he might be feeling in this picture. Again, have students cite evidence based on Paddington's expression and the setting. For example, is Paddington happy? Excited? Afraid? Worried?

Now have students complete the activity as directed.

ACTIVITY THREE

Distribute the activity sheet and read the directions with students. Have them complete the activity and review their findings with

one another. Then, direct students to take the activity sheet home to challenge parents to find the differences between the images.
