

# GET ONBOARD!

Snoopy is trying two new sports, surfing and skateboarding. With your team, solve these math problems to help Snoopy train for these sports. Then help Snoopy decode a message about sports safety.

**Part 1:** Solve the problems below.

1. Snoopy likes to surf. He has to swim out on his surfboard to “catch” a wave. In the morning, he swam 2 miles. In the afternoon, he swam 3 miles. How far did Snoopy swim today?

2 miles + 3 miles = \_\_\_\_\_ miles

2. In the morning, Snoopy rode 5 waves. He “wiped out” on one of them. In the afternoon, he rode 6 waves without falling. How many waves did he ride all the way to the beach today?

5 waves – 1 wave = \_\_\_\_\_ waves + 6 waves = \_\_\_\_\_ waves

3. Snoopy switches to skateboarding. He uses a skateboard that is 2 feet long. How many inches long is Snoopy’s skateboard? Hint: 1 foot = 12 inches

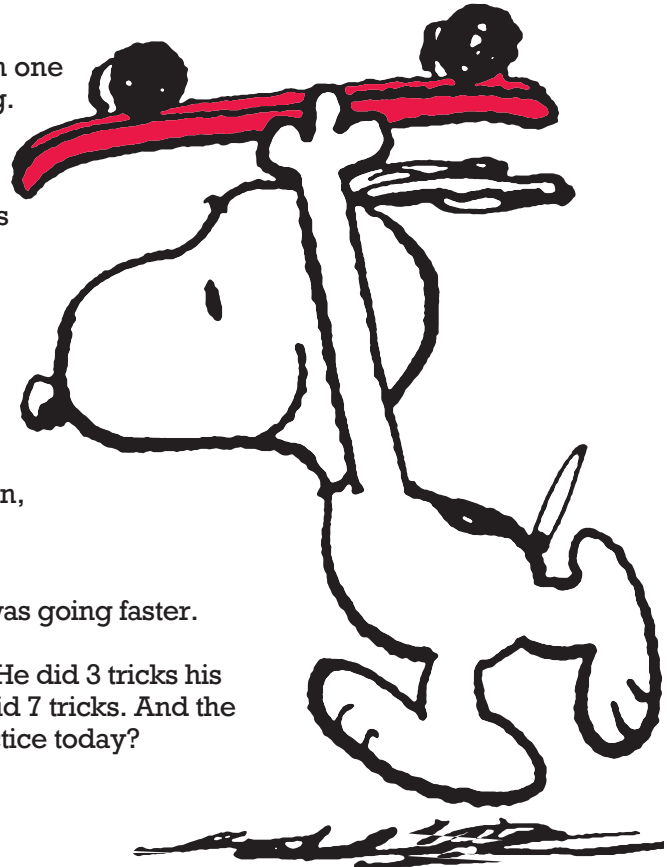
12 inches + 12 inches = \_\_\_\_\_ inches

4. Snoopy goes faster when he skateboards downhill. This morning he went 12 miles per hour. In the afternoon, he went 7 miles per hour. When was he skateboarding downhill?

5. Snoopy practices his skateboarding tricks at a skatepark. He did 3 tricks his first time around the skatepark course. The next time he did 7 tricks. And the last time he did 9 tricks. How many tricks did Snoopy practice today?

3 tricks + 7 tricks + 9 tricks = \_\_\_\_\_ tricks
