How to Use the Activities

Download and photocopy this guide, the three activity sheets, and the family/caregiver letter. Prepare the materials for each activity in advance. Help children by reading each activity sheet to them.





Materials needed: activity sheet, crayons

To start this activity, have a sing-along with the children. Start singing a favorite song. Encourage the children to join in. When you have finished the song, ask the children to share some of their favorite songs. Make it a game by letting each child sing or hum a few notes while you and the other children try to figure out the song's title. Then sing each song together. If the songs contain motions, do those as well.

Ask the children to share how the songs made them feel. Tell them that music is a fun and creative way to express ideas and emotions. In the Blue's Clues & You! special, Blue's Sing-Along Spectacular!, Josh is excited to share music with his friends in a backyard concert, and Blue is eager to sing a song!

Pass out the activity sheet. Tell the children that Blue has given them clues to another song that she wants to sing. Can they figure out the song by looking at the clues? Gently guide the children through the three clues on the sheet one at a time, and invite them to share what song they think it might be as you go along. For the first clue, ask the



children: What song is about something that is shaped like a rectangle? Let them share their responses. Look at the second clue and ask: What song is about something that is shaped like a rectangle and yellow? Invite responses. And finally for the third clue, ask: What song is about something that is shaped like a rectangle, is yellow, and has wheels?

Answer: "The Wheels on the Bus"

Once the children figure out the song, have them color the sheet. Then sing the song, acting out the verses. Lyrics can be found at www.kididdles.com/lyrics/b014.html.

Extension idea: Play a musical movement game. Have the children do silly dancing while music plays, and when the music stops, freeze in a silly position.

Activity 2 Make Your Own Farm

Materials needed: Internet-connected device, activity sheet, crayons

Start this activity by asking the children if they can figure out another song that Blue likes. Give them a hint by making some animal noises. Then hum a few bars of "Old MacDonald Had a Farm." Once they guess correctly, show the children the "Old MacDonald Nursery Rhyme Sing Along with Josh and Blue" video available at www.youtube.com/watch?v=c_z7AE6KT9k.



After viewing the video, have the children brainstorm items on a farm. Ask them to name animals and other items that might be on a farm. Then play a game by reading them the examples below. If the animals or other items might be found on a farm, the children should clap their hands or give a thumbs-up. If the animal or item is not usually found on a farm, they should stomp their feet, or give a thumbs down. Animals and items on a farm: cows, pigs, horses, sheep, goats, chickens, dogs, cats, farmers, barns, tractor, shovels, buckets, plants. Animals and items not found on farms: whale, giraffe, lobster, elephant, tiger, panda bear, lion, octopus, boat, castle, astronaut, igloo.

Pass out the activity sheet. Ask students to identify the animals on the sheet. Explain that one animal in each row looks different than the others. Children will circle the image that is different and then count the animals on the page. (Answer: 10 — don't forget Blue!) Review the answers together. Then let the children color the sheet.

Extension Idea: Make your own farm! Have the children brainstorm names of farm animals and the sounds they make. Then have the children draw and decorate their own animal picture on the back of the activity sheet to hold up as they sing the song, taking turns to introduce their farm animal and its sound.

Activity 3 Let's Play!

Materials needed: activity sheet, crayons, pencils, two white paper plates per child, popcorn kernels, stapler

Ask the children to share if they play a musical instrument, or if they know someone who does. What instrument do they play? What does it sound like? Talk about words that describe sounds, such as high, low, deep, clear, loud, etc.

Tell the children that several instruments are featured in the *Blue's Clues & You!* special, *Blue's Sing-Along Spectacular!*, and each of these instruments makes a unique sound and is played differently. Ask the children to name instruments that they see in the show or that they know. Review some of the instruments featured in the episode:

- Explain that guitars and pianos make a sound when a string is plucked or hit, so they are called string instruments. (Pianos are considered percussion instruments too.)
- The saxophone is a wind instrument because you blow "wind" into it to make a sound.
- A maraca is a percussion instrument because when you shake it, the little stones or seeds inside beat against the sides, and make a sound. A drum is also a percussion instrument.

Pass out the activity sheet. Ask the children to find the musical instruments on the page and circle them. Review the answers and count the instruments. (Answer: 8 — don't forget the guitar Josh is holding and Tickety Tock's bells!) Then have the children color the activity sheet.

Extension Ideas: Help the children make their own percussion instruments. Start by having the children color the bottoms of two plain, white paper plates. Then staple the paper plates together around the edges, top to top, until they are almost closed, with only a small opening left. Pour a small amount of popcorn kernels into the opening, and then staple the opening closed. Using the instruments to shake, sing, and dance!

Use the handcrafted instruments to create your own version of a "backyard concert." Have the children suggest songs and create a song list to perform. Rehearse and put on a show. Consider inviting family members to watch or take a video of the concert to share with families. Create additional instruments out of paper, cardboard, paper towel tubes, and craft supplies to add to your show.

- Play your own version of Blue's Clues. Draw three clues to one of your family's favorite songs for other family members to figure out.

- Listen to new songs together and talk about what you like or do not like about the music to practice language skills.
- Make a summer playlist of your family's favorite songs.
- Choose one or two letters and create silly songs only with words that start with the selected letters to reinforce letter-sound recognition.
- Play a musical movement game. Dance while music plays, and when the music stops, freeze in a silly position.
- Take dance breaks or have an after-dinner dance to get active by dancing to your family's favorite songs.
