How to Use the Activity:

A Pirate's Tools

Print out and make copies of the activity sheet. Children will need markers or crayons for the activity. Help children by reading the activity sheet to them.

To start, ask children to name types of jobs they are familiar with, such as firefighters, teachers, shopkeepers, etc. Guide them by giving them clues to identify jobs if needed. For each job title given, ask the children to name some of the tools each person needs to perform the work that is required, such as uniforms,

fire truck, desk, computers, cash register, products to sell, etc.

Explain that Santiago's mission is to protect treasures and make sure that

Isla Encanto—the island where he lives—its people, animals, and traditions, are safe from danger. Santiago lives by the Good Pirate Code. A good pirate should always stand by his or her mateys (friends) and always do what's right.

After sharing, ask children what kinds of tools a good pirate would need to be a pirate protector. Encourage children's imagination further by suggesting that the tools can also be magical. Allow children to share their ideas.


Distribute the activity sheet. The children should circle only the objects that Santiago needs to be the best pirate protector he can be. Then have children take turns sharing an item they circled and give their reason why they circled it. Likewise, have children share items they did not circle and why.

Answers: Items circled: the ship, pirate's hat, spyglass, compass, map, journal

Activity Extension: Have the children imagine they could create a special magical tool for their family. What tool would they create? What would it do? Discuss the children's ideas, then have them draw a picture of their tool and describe what it does.


