THE BUZZ ABOUT BEES Be an Animal Champion

Honeybees are endangered. Bees are disappearing. One reason is because their food source is disappearing. Bees eat pollen and nectar from flowers. Because of habitat loss, there are fewer flowers, so bees have less to eat. Plus, when they are eating pollen, bees also spread pollen from plant to plant. This is called *pollination* and it helps plants grow. Fewer bees mean less pollination, which can mean fewer fruits and vegetables for us. That's why it is a good idea to plant flowers so that bees have enough food to eat.
