**Where:** Alaska to South America

**Species examples:** Rufous Hummingbird, Western Tanager

### Mississippi Flyway

**Where:** Canada to the Gulf of Mexico

**Species examples:** Bullock's Oriole, Snow Goose

### Atlantic Flyway

**Where:** Canada to the Caribbean

**Species examples:** Mallard, Piping Plover

Atlantic Flyway

### Central Flyway

**Where:** Canada to Central and South America

**Species examples:** Sandhill Crane, Cedar Waxwing



## FACTS ABOUT MALLARDS!

- Male mallards (drakes) have green head feathers. Female mallards (hens) have brown head feathers.
- Only female mallards quack! Males make a quiet, rasping sound.
- Mallards are omnivorous. That means they eat both plants and animals.
- Mallards live almost everywhere — North America, Asia, Europe, Australia, and Africa.
